

OER Internship in Environmental Law

The New York City Mayor's Office of Environmental Remediation (OER) seeks a recent law school graduate or third year law student for an unpaid internship in environmental law. OER operates the nation's only voluntary brownfield cleanup program run by a municipality. The office works with developers and land owners across New York City to address site contamination issues as the first step in the redevelopment of private property.

The successful candidate will provide legal support for the office's remedial programs. In the process, the fellow will learn about the land development process, environmental review, and administrative rule-making, conduct real estate work, and be exposed to environmental policy. Prior legal interns have said their experience at OER diversified their resume and advanced their job search. The legal intern will conduct research, draft documents, and attend interagency meetings. Knowledge of environmental law and administrative law is preferred. Excellent oral and written communication skills are required.
